### Checklist

- Valid passport\*: If you need a visa, apply for it well in advance
- Prescriptions (optical and general); extra medication (recommended)
- Credit card (MasterCard/VISA), debit card (Maestro/EC)
- ISIC card (recommended, [www.isic.de](http://www.isic.de))
- Weatherproof clothes and sturdy shoes
- Toiletry brands may differ from those in your home country, so you may want to bring your own
- Please bring your own towels, as they will not be provided for you during the month of August. Bed linen, sheets, blankets and kitchen utensils will be provided
- Photocopies of your passport and other important documents: Never carry your original passport with you unless you are travelling
- Keep copies of your credit card numbers and phone numbers in order to cancel cards in case they are lost or stolen. Keep this information separate from your wallet.

\* Entry to the UK requires a valid passport. European ID cards are no longer sufficient.

## Travel to the Programme (June 30<sup>th</sup> – September 7<sup>th</sup>)

You will need to organize your own travel **to and from** the programme.

**Please send us your travel information** (dates of travel, depart/arrival time, airline information) via email ([amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de](mailto:amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de)) as soon as you have booked your trips. Simplify your travel reimbursement by sending us your proof of payment before the programme starts.

**ARRIVAL in Munich:** You should plan to arrive at the Munich Airport no later than **1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 30<sup>th</sup>**. The programme starts with the Opening Retreat in the Bavarian mountains (June 30<sup>th</sup> – July 3<sup>rd</sup>).

You are welcome to arrange travel either earlier or later than the programme, but we cannot cover housing or any other benefits (transportation pass, insurance, etc.) before or after the official programme start/end. Accommodation for you is arranged from **June 30<sup>th</sup> to September 7<sup>th</sup>** (including Opening Retreat and Cambridge Symposium).

**DEPARTURE from Munich:** On August 31<sup>st</sup>, we will travel to the Bavarian countryside and spend three days at lake Schliersee. On September 3<sup>rd</sup>, we will travel from there to Munich Airport and take the flight to London together. The trip to Cambridge is arranged and covered by the programme for all scholars. The programme ends with the Cambridge Symposium (September 3<sup>rd</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023). **Please book your return tickets to your home or study country from Cambridge for September 7<sup>th</sup>**. Airport transfers are arranged by the programme.

**REFUND:** We will refund **travel expenses** to and from the programme up to **€350**. All travel expenses, including visa fees, can only be refunded with submission of **original receipts (proof of payment) and boarding passes**. Finalize all travel arrangements before coming to Munich, as we must receive all travel receipts by the second week of the programme.

**Keep all invoices (and proof of payment), train tickets, boarding passes, and other travel receipts for reimbursement of travel costs!**

## How to get LMU Munich on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023

### Arrival by airplane:

Please take the S-Bahn (S8 or S1) from the airport, which departs every 10 minutes. You will have to buy a ticket (either in the [MVV app](#), at ticket machines, or the S-Bahn help desk at the airport) and be sure to validate it before boarding. To validate a paper ticket, you have to insert it into the blue box located at the entrances to the platform. Do not enter the platform or train without validating the ticket first. Online tickets are pre-validated.

At “Marienplatz” change to subway U6 in direction “Garching Forschungszentrum” or U3 in direction “Moosach”. Exit at the station “Universität”.

Fare: € 13,00 (single ticket, zones M - 5)

### Arrival by train:

Please take the S-Bahn from the main train station (“Hauptbahnhof”) to the station “Marienplatz” (many S-Bahn choices). From there take the subway U6 in direction “Garching Forschungszentrum” or U3 in direction “Moosach”. Exit at the station “Universität”.

Fare: € 3,70 (single ticket, zone M)

### Arrival by bus at ZOB (Central bus station):

At the central bus station (ZOB) you can take any “S-Bahn” in direction “Hauptbahnhof”. At “Marienplatz” change to subway U6 in direction “Garching Forschungszentrum” or U3 in direction “Moosach”. Exit at the station “Universität”.

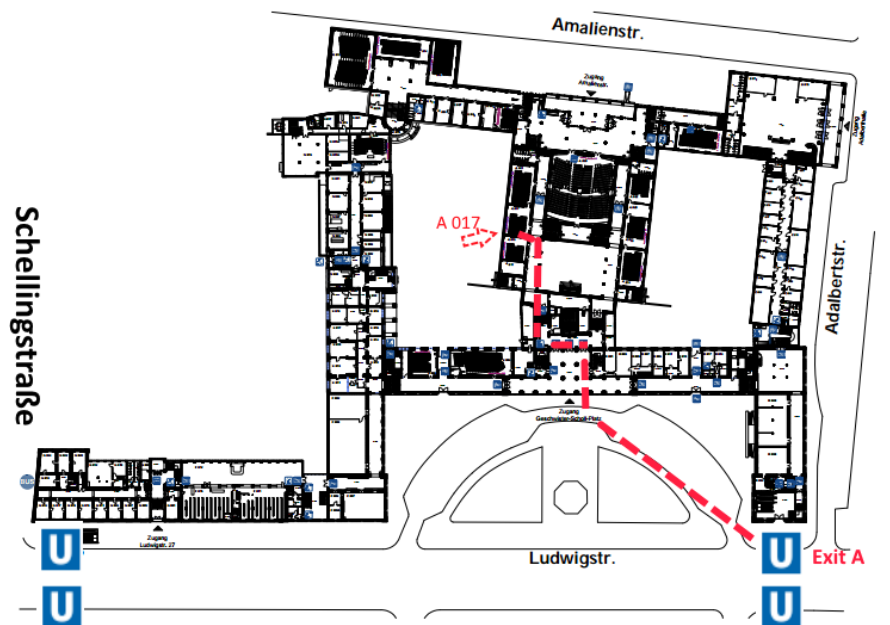

**Departure by bus:** 30<sup>th</sup> June, 4:00 p.m.

The schedule for the Opening Retreat will be sent to you by email in June.

On July 3<sup>rd</sup> we will arrive in Munich late in the afternoon and the bus will take you to your accommodation.

Before the return trip from Garmisch, our staff will hand out the University Mensa (cafeteria) Card and the first instalment of the scholarship in cash, which is €300. The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> instalments will follow via bank transfer on July 20<sup>th</sup> and August 5<sup>th</sup>. You will also receive a programme tote including programme information, a map of Munich, city information, as well as a map of Munich's public transportation system (MVG).

## Start in the lab

On July 4<sup>th</sup> you will start with your laboratory projects. You will be expected by your lab supervisors by 9:00 a.m. (unless otherwise instructed by your supervisor).

**Scholars should be prepared to begin lab work immediately, so please complete your literature review and background preparations before leaving for Germany!**

## Programme Activities

**Please note:** We strongly recommend adding the calendar to your device, as details for some events can change on a short notice. It also helps us know that everyone has an up-to-date overview of events, including reminders.

### Scholar research project presentations (weekly, July 19<sup>th</sup> to August 23<sup>rd</sup>)

Scholars will meet once a week to discuss their research projects with one another. In these sessions, groups of 4/5 scholars will give a short (10 min.) presentation on their research project hypothesis(-ses), methods/techniques utilized, and current challenges faced. Each presentation will be followed by a short Q&A. The seminars, called Slice of Science, will be catered with pizza. We highly recommend you to invite your mentors/tutors and lab colleagues to these sessions, and ask that they RSVP to [amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de](mailto:amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de) at least 2 days beforehand.

### Academic Workshops

Scholars participate in several workshops: Short Presentations, Scientific Writing, Poster Design & Presentation, Data Analysis with Python, and How to Apply for a Graduate Position.

### Insight in the Biotech Industry

To gain insight into the Biotech industry, scholars will visit the high-tech laboratories of the Amgen Research Munich GmbH, as well as the IZB Martinsried, a hotspot for Life Science Start-Ups.

### Munich Closing Poster Session (August 30<sup>th</sup>)

Scholars will present their project posters to the Munich academic community, allowing an opportunity to prepare for the Cambridge Symposium. The event is followed by programme closing remarks by organisers and guests, and lunch. Dress code is smart.

### Closing Retreat (August 31<sup>st</sup> – September 3<sup>rd</sup>)

Since accommodation is not available in Munich for September, we will host a closing retreat in the Bavarian countryside, to reflect on the summer and recharge our batteries before the Cambridge Symposium. Feedback sessions and excursions in the surroundings are being planned.

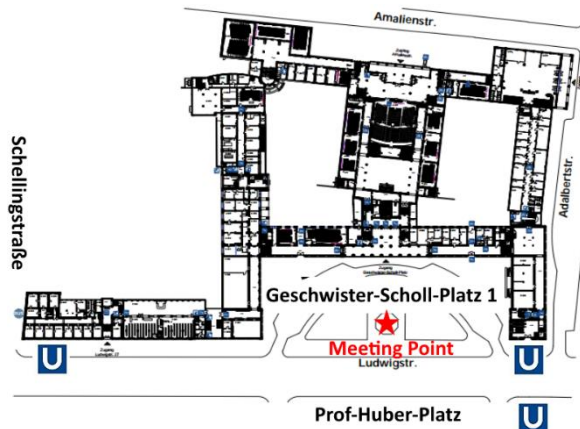

The costs for the bus and tickets for the activities are covered by the programme. You are responsible for your food and beverages. Always bring weatherproof clothing and proper shoes with you. Since we will be travelling by bus, you can always leave personal belongings in the bus.

## Accommodation

Accommodation in Munich is very competitive. Due to the extremely tight student-housing situation in Munich and semester overlapping in July, scholars will live in two separate locations over the summer.

### July

In July, students will be accommodated in "Living Hotel at the Deutsches Museum" – an apartment complex located directly in the city center only a few steps away from the Isar river and Deutsches Museum, various sightseeing locations, bistros and pubs, grocery stores.

You will reside in an apartment of your own with a small kitchen corner, a bathroom with shower and a bedroom with working space. You will be provided towels and sheets. Laundry can be washed and dried/ironed in the laundry room located in the basement (for a fee). Kitchen utensils (silverware, plates, cups, bowls, and pots) are also provided. Wi-Fi is included and you will have access to the in-house gym.

You can address any issue to the reception or to your programme coordinator.

### August

In August scholars will stay in the student residence "Olympiadorf (Olympic Village)", close to the subway station "Olympiazentrum" (Subway U3).

Here you will live in 2-story bungalows equipped with a bathroom and a small kitchen where you can prepare meals. You will be provided with a plate, a cup, a bowl, a pan, and one set of silverware, as well as bedding (sheets and blankets), which can be cleaned at the laundry facilities close to the bungalows. **Towels will not be provided.** We kindly ask you to acquire/bring them according to your own personal needs.

### Keys for your bungalows

Each student will receive one key/a set of keys for their bungalow. If you lose the key, it will cost you approx. € 150.

Never leave your room without a key because the door shuts easily and can only be opened with a key.

In case you get locked out during the day, you can call the dorm supervisor. Should this happen during the evening or night, please do not call a locksmith yourself! Call the emergency number +49 (0) 176 666 82778. You might also stay in a colleague's room and ask the dorm supervisor to assist you the following morning.

## Notes on accommodation

### Check-out from Living Hotels

The move is scheduled for August 2<sup>nd</sup> early in the morning (you are expected to be in the lab after moving). There will be a bus taking you and your luggage to Olympiadorf. Further details will be provided closer to the date.

### Check-out from Olympiadorf

You have to leave the rooms on August 31<sup>st</sup> in the morning, before traveling to the closing retreat. A bus will pick you up at approx. 10:00 a.m. and take you to the "Jugendherberge" at Schliersee.

Students are expected to leave their rooms in a clean condition and remember to return the key to their dorm supervisor. More information regarding dorm check-out will be provided in Munich.

**It is prohibited to pass your room to someone else or to sub-let it.**

In Munich, tap water is drinkable and of very good quality.

Recycling is highly encouraged in Germany and therefore glass and plastic



bottles, as well as metal drink cans come with a deposit (called "Pfand") that you can get back by returning the bottles/cans.



Generally, garbage should be sorted into waste, paper, glass/metal, and plastic.

## Electricity

In Germany, electronic devices run at 220 – 230V with a frequency of 50 Hz. Please make sure that your plugs fit a type C or type F socket or consider purchasing an electronic adapter before your arrival.



## Public Transportation – The "Deutschlandticket"

Monthly transportation passes for the duration of the programme will be reimbursed to you as part of the benefits. As of May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the "Deutschlandticket" (D-Ticket) has been introduced in Germany. It costs €49/month and is valid on all local and regional public transport (exception: ICE / EC trains) throughout Germany. This means you can travel throughout Germany as often as you wish (including some locations near the borders, such as Salzburg).

The D-Ticket is only purchasable individually via credit/debit card as an online pass for your smartphone. It is provided as subscription-model only but can be cancelled on a monthly basis. You will therefore need to install the app, purchase the ticket (needed for July and August) and then **cancel your subscription no later than August 10<sup>th</sup>**. More information and a tutorial on downloading the app and subscribing to the D-Ticket will be provided in the coming weeks via email. Your travel refund will include the additional costs for the 2 months use of the D-Ticket (max. €350 + €98).

## Insurance

Health, Travel, Liability, and Accident Insurance is provided by the programme and also covers your UK trip to the Cambridge Symposium. You have already received an electronic copy of your policy. You will receive a printed copy of the original policy after your arrival in Munich, as you will need a copy of this whenever you should visit a doctor.

**Note:** The insurance is valid from June 30<sup>th</sup> until September 7<sup>th</sup>. If you plan to arrive earlier or stay longer, please make sure to extend your insurance.

## Phone

Check with your current cell phone provider what the exact conditions for calling or using the internet abroad are and whether it is financially feasible to change your contract accordingly.

**Prepaid Cards:** You might also consider purchasing a SIM-card, which has a German number and costs approx. €10.00 to charge. You can use them with your own cell phone. Such cards can be bought at supermarkets and will make it easier for you to communicate with each other.

**Please note:** Most of the SIM-cards are not automatically micro SIM-cards (you need them for iPhone, e.g.)

## Internet

### At the Opening Retreat

You will receive Wifi access information at check-in.

### At the Living Hotel

All apartments in the complex have Wifi access.

### At the Olympic Village

All rooms in the student residence are equipped for internet access by Ethernet cable. **Please bring your own Ethernet cable with you and an adapter in case your laptop does not have a LAN socket** to be able to get internet access. Wifi is not provided, but there are solutions you can take into consideration, such as:

It provides researchers, teachers and students easy and secure network access when visiting another institution. You do not have to pay for using eduroam. Students will receive a registration email from the wifi provider eduroam. Please make sure you register directly once you receive this email (closer to your arrival in Munich).

## Mensa Card

In the cafeterias managed by the Student Union or “Studentenwerk” you will have to pay with your “Mensa Card” (i.e. Cafeteria Card), a chip-based electronic purchase system.

For the Max-Planck-Institute and Helmholtz cafeterias, you will need to pay cash.

You will receive a Mensa Card for meals during workshops. You have to load credit on your cards at certain terminals (called “Aufwerter”) located at the entrance of each cafeteria (operating with bills). For the beginning, you will get €30 credit from the programme.

The Mensa Card will be handed out during the Opening Retreat and needs to be returned to programme organisers before our trip to Cambridge.

## Sports Activities

In Munich the sport locations of the university are restricted to long-term students of the LMU. We can recommend you some possibilities open to the public. Please note that in July you have access to the gym in the apartment complex.

**Outdoor activities:** Munich has many large parks, such as the English Garden, the Olympic Park or Luitpold Park. These green areas are great for jogging, playing soccer or other outdoor activities.

**Biking:** Munich is an excellent city for biking. Bikes can be rented for day trips (Radverleih i. HBf., Hauptbahnhof) or at any time when using services such as “MVG Rad”. **Swimming:** There are a variety of excellent public indoor and outdoor swimming pools all around Munich, for example the Olympic Swimming Pool (Coubertinplatz 1). Please look at the SWM Munich website for a full listing: [www.swm.de/english/m-baeder.html](http://www.swm.de/english/m-baeder.html)

**Sauna:** The swimming halls are usually combined with a sauna facility. Please look at the SWM Munich website for a full listing: [www.swm.de/english/m-baeder/sauna.html](http://www.swm.de/english/m-baeder/sauna.html)

**Tennis:** One possibility to play tennis is at the courts of Olympic Centre (Spiridon-Louis-Ring 21), where tennis rackets may also be rented. The prices vary depending on the timeslot and day of the week. **Gym:** For most gyms, a membership of several months is required. Some centres offer passes in sets of ten sessions, which can be shared by several students.

## Shopping Facilities

### Opening hours / General

Opening hours are usually 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m., although smaller shops, such as bakeries, often close earlier. **Please note that all shops and supermarkets are closed on Sundays and holidays (e.g. 15<sup>th</sup> August)**, with the exception of some shops at the main train stations (“Hauptbahnhof” and “Ostbahnhof”) or large gas stations. Some bakeries are open on Sunday before mid-day.

### Shopping Malls

The best option for shopping is the pedestrian zone in the city center between Marienplatz and Karlsplatz. Munich has some shopping malls outside of the city center, such as the “Olympia-Einkaufszentrum” (U3 > Olympia-Einkaufszentrum; [www.olympia-einkaufszentrum.de](http://www.olympia-einkaufszentrum.de)), “Riem Arcaden” (U2 > Messestadt-West; [riemarcaden.de](http://riemarcaden.de)), Einkaufs-Center Neuperlach - pep (U5 > Neuperlach Zentrum; [www.einkaufscenter-neuperlach.de](http://www.einkaufscenter-neuperlach.de)), “PasingArcaden” (S-Bahn > Pasing; [www.pasing-arcaden.de](http://www.pasing-arcaden.de)).
